COMPARING COLLEGES IS MORE OF AN ART THAN A SCIENCE

COMPILE A LIST OF POSSIBLE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

• Start by listing colleges that offer the majors that interest you and that meet other factors you find important.

SCHEDULE CAMPUS VISITS

 Visiting several colleges is important because it will help you determine which college fits you best, both socially and academically. If possible, try to visit when classes are in session. No matter how perfect a college may seem on paper or online, nothing compares to the impression you get when you're on campus.

QUESTIONS TO ASK AND THINGS TO OBSERVE ON A COLLEGE VISIT

Admission and Financial Aid

- What are the GPA and ACT/SAT test core requirements for admission and scholarships?
- What are the application deadlines for admission and financial aid?
- Is there an admission application fee? If so, when is it due? Is it refundable?
- Does the school award institutional scholarships? How do you apply?
- Does the school award institutional scholarships? How do you apply?
- What's the cost of attendance? What items are included in the cost of attendance? Are there other costs (lab or health fees)?
- What types of payment plans are available? When is payment due?

Academic

- What type of academic calendar does the school have?
- What's the retention rate?
- What's the job placement rate? Do employers recruit on campus?
- How long, on average, does it take students to graduate? Is it difficult to get into the classes required for graduation?
- What's the student/faculty ratio? Does faculty include teaching assistants or do professors teach the majority of classes?
- What's the average class size? Are the professors accessible to students?
- What's the academic advising system like? Are you assigned an adviser or do you choose your own?
- How are AP, CLEP, Postsecondary Enrollment and Dual Enrollment courses treated?

Campus

- Is a car necessary? Is parking available? How much does it cost? What type of public transportation is available?
- Do many students use bicycles around campus or town? Is there a secure place to keep or store a bicycle?
- Are there computes in the residence hall rooms or are the rooms equipped for them? Do they offer wireless internet access?
- What types of meal plans are available? Are there alternative options available besides the dining hall?
- What's the crime on rate on campus?

Student Life

- Are there fraternities and sororities on campus? What other student organizations could you join?
- What are the housing options? Are there options to live in a sorority or fraternity house? Is Housing guaranteed?
- How diverse is the student body? What's the male/female ratio? Do the majority of students come from within or outside of the state?
- What types of cultural events (music, theater, art) are offered?

JUNIOR TIPS

- If you take AP courses, consider AP exams.
- Continue to search for scholarships.
- Register now for the June ACT or SAT.
- Compare your impressions of each college and rank them according to preference.
- Narrow your college choices to five or fewer and highlight the important features of each.
- Consider taking a summer course at a local college.
- Find a summer job related to your career interest or do community service. Grades aren't the only thing colleges evaluate.
- Prospective student athletes: Ask your school counselor regarding an official transcript to the NCAA Eligibility Center.

SENIOR TIPS

- Visit an ICAN Center to review and compare financial aid packages from colleges.
 Download the Compare College Costs worksheet from the ICAN Resource Zone.
- Decide which college you'll attend. Have your final transcript sent to the college you will be attending.
- Return all necessary documents, including financial aid forms, to your college.
- Notify the college about any scholarships you receive.
- Save money to help with college expenses.

RAISE.ME SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR GRADES 9 - 12

Students who wish to attend Buena Vista University, Clarke University, Cornell College, Drake University, Luther College and The University of Iowa can earn up to \$1200 over 4 years of high school. These six Iowa colleges have partnered with Raise.me micro-scholarship program in order to improve college readiness and affordability in Iowa. This scholarship platform provides a series of "micro-scholarships" students can accumulate throughout their high school career. These incentives are designed to encourage high school students to pursue options in higher education.

This year's seniors have until March 15, 2017 to add items to their online portfolio in order to receive the scholarship next fall. These incentives include items such as perfect attendance (\$75), take four years of a foreign language and earn \$100 or earn a grade of A or B in Geometry (\$25). Raise.me is entirely free and students only need to go online and create an account.

The next two pages detail each individual scholarship amount as awarded by The University of Iowa for the Raise.Me program. Over 100 colleges in the United States participate and award varying amounts which of microscholarships which may be greater than those provided by UI.
