JUNIOR TIPS

- Determine a college budget based on salary expectations for your chosen career or industry. Visit ACTprofile.org.
- Make sure you enroll in senior classes that fulfill the credits you need for college.
- Put together a resume listing your activities, volunteer experiences, academic achievements and employment.
- Register now for the April ACT if you plan to take it.
- It's time to schedule college visits. Revisit your career assessment results and schedule visits with schools that meet your career and budget needs. During each college visit, meet with the admissions and financial aid offices. Download a helpful checklist at ICANSucceed.org/materials.
- Talk to your school counselor about AP courses. Consider taking honors or college-level classes.

SENIOR TIPS

- Need help filing a FAFSA? ICAN can help. Call 877-272-4692 to schedule an appointment.
- Submit your FAFSA if you haven't already done so.
- Confirm that the colleges you've applied to have received your first-semester transcripts.
- Keep your grades up – second semester grades are important and can affect scholarship eligibility and college admittance.
- Watch for your Student Aid Report (SAR). Check that it lists all the colleges requiring receipt of your FAFSA.
- Review your budget and financial plan for college. Talk with your parents about cost responsibility.
- Begin making plans for a summer job.
- Ask your school counselor about local scholarships.

5. Register for a Net-ID (Directions included on website)
6. Click on "Apply on our FinAidScholar Website!"
7. Log in with your Net-ID
8. Select the Freshman Application
9. Click on "Click Here to Apply!"
10. Complete the application by 1 December
11. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) prior to December 1st.
 - a. The first time a student/family is able to complete the FAFSA application is October 1st of the student's senior year.

Note: If you have already completed the FinAidScholar application, you do NOT need to complete another one. This application is ONLY for scholarships administered through The Office of Student Financial Aid. Please be sure to check with Admissions, your college and/or department, and private donors to maximize your scholarship search. Student Loan Debt Topic of February Visit

Sara Goldrick-Rab, the author of *Paying the Price: College Costs, Financial Aid, and the Betrayal of the American Dream*, will give a public lecture on February 13 at 7:00 pm at the Iowa City Public Library. She will also speak that same day at the Inequality Seminar at 2:00 pm in W113 Seashore Hall.

Goldrick-Rab is Professor of Higher Education Policy & Sociology at Temple University, and Founder of the Wisconsin HOPE Lab, the nation's only translational research laboratory seeking ways to make college more affordable.

Her commitment to scholar-activism is evidenced by her broad profile of research and writing dissecting the intended and unintended consequences of the college-for-all movement in the United States. In more than a dozen experimental, longitudinal, and mixed-methods studies, she has examined the efficacy and distributional implications of financial aid policies, welfare reform, transfer practices, and a range of interventions aimed at increasing college attainment among marginalized populations. She provides extensive service to local, state, and national communities, working directly with governors and state legislators to craft policies to make college more affordable, collaborating with non-profit organizations seeking to examine the effects of their practices, and providing technical assistance to Congressional staff, think tanks, and membership organizations.

RAISE.ME SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR GRADES 9 - 12

Students who wish to attend Buena Vista University, Clarke University, Cornell College, Drake University, Luther College and The University of Iowa can earn up to \$1200 over 4 years of high school. These six Iowa colleges have partnered with Raise.me micro-scholarship program in order to improve college readiness and affordability in Iowa. This scholarship platform provides a series of “micro-scholarships” students can accumulate throughout their high school career. These incentives are designed to encourage high school students to pursue options in higher education.

This year’s seniors have until March 15, 2017 to add items to their online portfolio in order to receive the scholarship next fall. These incentives include items such as perfect attendance (\$75), take four years of a foreign language and earn \$100 or earn a grade of A or B in Geometry (\$25). Raise.me is entirely free and students only need to go online and create an account.

PARAMETERS

Max award per student:
\$1,200 total or \$300 / year

Eligibility:

Students at eligible Iowa high schools with a cumulative, un-weighted GPA of 3.00 that apply by May 1st

Earnings Deadline:

Students can earn through March 15 of their senior year







Maintenance Requirements:

Maintain continuous full-time enrollment each semester and a 2.00 cumulative University of Iowa grade-point average, or higher, depending on award level.

Other Requirements:

Students must send ACT scores to IOWA to get credit for Take the ACT Award

	Take Algebra I, Algebra II, Advanced Algebra, Algebra II with Trigonometry, Trigonometry, or Geometry Earn \$25 for taking Algebra I, Algebra II, Advanced Algebra, Algebra II with Trigonometry, Trigonometry, and Geometry with a minimum grade of B.

	Take AP or IB Math, Science, or English Earn \$50 for taking a AP or IB course in English, Math or Science, with a minimum grade of B
	Take Dual Enrollment Math, Science, or English Earn \$25 for taking Advanced/Honor, or Dual Enrollment in English, Math or Science, with a minimum grade of B
	Take 4+ Years of Foreign Language Earn \$100 for taking 4+ years of the same foreign language.
