

Booster Club Minutes May 5, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 7:01, 8 members were present with two late arrivals.

Officer Election:

Mark presented the slate of officers, Pres: Mark Fiala, VP: Mike Kadlec, Treasurer: Jim Miller, Secretary: Lisa Stodola. Mark declared the entire slate of officers be approved by acclamation. Included in this slate are the two additional appointments by Mark of Deb Winter as the Volunteer Coordinator and Marc VanBuren as the buyer.

Minutes

Rick Pike motioned the minutes of the April meeting be approved with the noted corrections. Mike Kadlec seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

Coaches Comments

Volleyball-MaryKay VanOort. MaryKay wasn't scheduled, but she made some brief comments about the indoor volleyball concession stand and how the overall season went. She discussed some of the returning players.

Activities Director

Chris Deam shared that the last home track meet for Jefferson was today. The spring sports are wrapping up fast.

A new men's basketball coach has been hired, Brandon Horman. This leaves a position for the assistant basketball coach.

Mr. Deam passed his CAA test.

Baseball begins today and softball starts Monday. There is a metro tournament for baseball on Memorial Day. Jefferson will host four teams. Also noteworthy, Coach Rodenkirk and wife recently welcomed a baby girl, no other details available.

The renovation on the old gym is complete. The renovation on the new gym has started. The athletic trainer, Suzi, has been moved to Mr. Deam's office. The new gym is expected to be complete by June 16 when all the sport camps start.

There is a Ford Drive for Your School program. Washington and Kennedy just did it and raised about \$6,000 each. A Ford dealership will bring 4-5 cars to your school and for every test drive that takes place, the school gets \$25.

Concession Stand

Hours reported for April were 438.5 hours, with just 14 events. Lower Kingston has been open for the Varsity Women's soccer matches, but Jim Miller was not available for a report.

Kingston stand 2 had roof damage from a recent storm. The stand had water pouring in by the popcorn machine. The district put the damaged water barrier back in its place, but it still drips when it rains. The paperwork has been submitted for repair, but specifics are still TBD.

Old Business

The Farner Bocken food show was unbelievable. All who attended had a great time, enjoyed the samples, etc.

Mary Crane of Heinz has informed Mark that they have some Timberline Chili available, but only 10 cases for us. We must now purchase the chili at \$33/case, there are no more donations. This amount won't get us through the football season, but it will help. They will be making the mac n cheese once ready and will call us for pick up. A representative at the food show said they could get us the chili through Farner Bocken, so it's something to keep in mind.

The Iowa City semi-pro football is still up in the air. There are still events on the schedule with volunteer slots available and they will remain until Mark hears differently from the district.

Mike has fixed the broken freezer at Kingston.

New Business

Sam's Club membership is up for renewal. Mark will send the bill to Jim Miller for payment.

2014-2015 booster club meetings, do we need to continue to meet monthly? Mark has asked the club to consider this as well as possibly changing times. We will revisit this topic at a later meeting.

Mike Kadlec was approached by a gentleman from P&K in Hiawatha. Mike mentioned needing a gator for approximately two months during the softball season to assist with transporting product, etc from Kingston to softball stands. P&K has agreed to donate a Lincoln Way Golf Cart to us from approximately May 15-July 16 at no cost to us. Mike and Mark are currently trying to locate a garage for storage.

Kohl's has an AIA program, Associates in Action. They will donate \$500 to our nonprofit organization if we will allow them to send 5 associates to volunteer for three hours with our organization. We will be participating in this program.

Upcoming Events

After discussion, it was agreed to combine the Price Setting Meeting and the July and August meetings into one meeting. We will hold this meeting on Monday July 28. The price setting meeting will begin at 6pm with stand managers, officers, Chris Deam and the product manager having voting rights.
